Blueprint Medicines Corporation ("Blueprint Medicines") recognizes the importance of protecting the privacy of personal information and other information we may receive about visitors to BlueprintMedicines.com and other websites owned and/or controlled by Blueprint Medicines or through our other online and offline services that display or refer to this policy (collectively, this "website" or our "websites"). This Privacy Policy describes:

- the information that we collect or that you provide when you use our websites and other services;
- how we use, disclose (share), store and otherwise process that information;
- with whom we may share that information;
- the safeguards we use to protect that information; and
- the choices you may make with respect to information that identifies you or can be used to identify you ("personal information").

This Privacy Policy does not replace any consent form or notice that you may separately receive in connection with Blueprint Medicines' use or sharing of personal information. Blueprint Medicines may provide additional privacy notices at the time we collect such information. For example, we provide a specific privacy notice to clinical trial participants that describes our privacy practices in connection with conducting clinical trials. This type of an "in-time" notice will govern how we may process the information you provide at that time.

Collection of Personal Information

Personal Information You Provide

When you use our websites or other services, Blueprint Medicines may collect personal information. You may voluntarily submit personal information or in some cases, explicitly consent to its collection. For example, Blueprint Medicines collects personal information you provide to us through our websites when you (1) contact Blueprint Medicines with your questions and comments through the Contact page on this website, (2) send us an email, (3) complete a sign-up form to learn more about a clinical trial or medical condition, (4) complete a survey, or (5) consent to the collection of your personal information pertaining to your visit. We also collect personal information you provide to us through our offline interactions with you (e.g., by telephone or in person) or that you authorize others, such as your health care provider, to provide.

In connection with the use of our websites or other services, we may collect personal information such as:

- Personal and business contact information and preferences (e.g., name, job title and employer name, email address, mailing address and phone number);
- Professional credentials, education history, employment history and other information of the type included in a resume or curriculum vitae;
- Race and ethnicity (in connection with employment applications) should you elect to voluntarily share such information;
- Health and medical information (such as medical insurance details, information about physical and mental health conditions and diagnoses, treatments for medical conditions, genetic information, family medical history, and medications an individual may take, including the dosage, timing, and frequency) we collect in connection with managing clinical trials, conducting research, providing patient support programs, distributing and marketing our products, managing compassionate use and expanded access programs, and tracking adverse event reports; and
- Username and password that you may select in connection with establishing an account on our websites.

Please do not provide any personal information if you do not want it to be collected. However, without providing certain requested information, you may not be able to participate in or access certain features available on our websites or other services that require such information.

Information Automatically Collected

In addition, we automatically collect certain technical information about you (which may include your IP address) when you interact with our websites in order to improve and customize your browsing experience, for analytics and metrics about your visits to our websites and for marketing our products to you. For example, we may use website analytics tools on our websites to retrieve information from your browser, including the website you came from, the search engine and the keywords you used to find our websites, the pages you view within our websites, your browser add-ons, and your browser's width and height. Do Not Track Signals

We do not presently respond to browser 'do not track' requests. We do not control and are not responsible for third party tracking technologies that may be used on our websites. Such third parties may serve you content based on tracking you across different websites. You consent to potentially encountering third party tracking technologies when you use our websites.

Information Collected Through Other Sources

We may also obtain information about you (which may include personal information) through other sources, such as public websites or records or other third parties (e.g., health care professionals, patient groups, government agencies).

Use of Personal Information

We may use the personal information we collect for a variety of purposes including to:

- Respond to your inquiries, requests, and comments;
- Communicate about the products and services we offer;
- Process grants and sponsorship applications;
- Comply with legal and regulatory requirements, judicial process, and Blueprint Medicines' policies;
- Operate, evaluate, secure, and improve our websites and services;
- Staff, facilitate, and manage our clinical trials, research, studies, and related activities;
- Comply with regulatory monitoring and reporting obligations, such as those related to adverse events, product complaints, spend transparency, and patient safety;
- Protect against, identify, investigate, and respond to fraudulent, harmful, unauthorized, unethical or illegal activity;
- Track and respond to safety and product quality concerns, such as product recalls;
- Identify and engage thought leaders and external experts; and
- Facilitate our recruitment activities, such as processing employment applications, evaluating a job candidate for an employment activity, and monitoring recruitment statistics.

We may combine the personal information we collect about you online with the personal information we collect about you from our offline interactions with you (for example, our interactions by telephone or in person).

We may aggregate and/or de-identify the personal information we collect to create information that does not identify any individual and use that information for the above-listed purposes and other business purposes.

We may also combine any of the information we collect about you through our websites and services, including personal information, with information we obtain from other sources, such as public records or websites, or other third parties (e.g., health care professionals, patient groups, government agencies).

Sharing of Personal Information

Blueprint Medicines may share your personal information with:

- Blueprint Medicines' subsidiaries and corporate affiliates;
- Third parties and service providers, who work on Blueprint Medicines' behalf to provide certain services;
- Business partners with whom we collaborate regarding our investigational products and programs, such as scientific advisors, joint venture partners and strategic collaboration partners;
- Legal, regulatory, or other enforcement authorities and other third parties if required to comply with law, regulation, or judicial process or to protect the security, rights, and property of Blueprint Medicines or of users of the websites;
- Third parties in connection with a business deal (or potential business deal) such as a merger, consolidation, acquisition, reorganization or sale of asset or in the event of bankruptcy, in which case we will make reasonable efforts to require the recipient to honor this Privacy Policy but the information may be subject to the policies of the receiving organization; and
- Third parties to protect rights and interests, such as when needed for corporate audits, to investigate or respond to a complaint or threat, or to exercise our legal rights.

Use of Cookies

We collect information automatically about your use of this website through cookies and similar tracking technology such as LocalStorage and iframes. A cookie is a piece of information that your web browser stores on your device at the request of certain websites when you access the website. Cookies are useful because they allow a website to recognize a user's device. Cookies allow you to navigate between pages efficiently, remember preferences and generally improve the user experience. They can also be used to tailor advertising to your interests through tracking your browsing across websites. On certain Blueprint Medicines websites, we may also use cookies to identify users that have opted to receive information and invite them to complete a survey.

There are two primary types of cookies that are used: session cookies and persistent cookies. Session cookies are deleted automatically when you close your browser, and persistent cookies remain on your device after the browser is closed (for example to remember your user preferences when you return to the website). - <u>Strictly Necessary Cookies</u> We make use of certain essential cookies in order to enable you to move around the websites and use their features. Without these cookies, services you have asked for (such as navigating between pages) cannot be provided.
- <u>Performance Cookies</u> We make use of analytics cookies to analyze how our visitors use the websites and to monitor the websites' performance. This allows us to provide a high quality experience by

customizing our offering and quickly identifying and fixing any issues that arise. For example, we might use performance cookies to keep track of which pages are most popular and which method of linking between pages is most effective, and to determine why some pages are receiving error messages. We might also use these cookies to highlight articles or website services that we think will be of interest to you based on your usage of the website.

 <u>Website Functionality Cookies</u> – We make use of cookies to provide you with certain functionality. For example, we might use website functionality cookies to remember choices you make (such as your language or the region you are in), or to recognize the platform from which you access the websites, and to provide enhanced and more personal features. These cookies are not used to track your browsing on other third party sites.

We use Google Analytics and Google Tag Manager to help us analyze how visitors use our websites. These tools use performance cookies to collect standard Internet log information and visitor behavior information. For example, we may track the total number of visitors to this website, the number of visitors to each page of this website, and the domain names of our visitors' Internet service providers. Users in the European Economic Area, Switzerland and the UK

When processing personal information as described in this Privacy Policy, Blueprint Medicines relies on one of the following legal bases, as appropriate:

- To protect the vital interests of the patient;
- For Blueprint Medicines' legitimate interests, e.g., ensuring patient safety, conducting business relationships and conducting operations including strategy and marketing activities.

Blueprint Medicines is headquartered in the U.S. and as a result, personal information about you will be processed by Blueprint Medicines in the U.S. Blueprint Medicines may contract with service providers to process personal information on Blueprint Medicine's behalf; these service providers may be located outside of the EEA,

Switzerland and UK. Data protection laws in the U.S. or other countries may not offer you the same protections as the laws of the country in which you are residing when personal information about you is collected. When personal information is transferred outside of the country in which you are residing, we abide by the requirements of applicable law regarding such transfers, which may include reliance on the recipient's compliance with standard contractual clauses, your consent to the transfer, or other appropriate pathways.

Blueprint Medicines' ability or obligation to comply with your requests may be limited by applicable law. Blueprint Medicines will require appropriate evidence of your identity or to be provided with additional relevant information based on your relationship with us before we are able to act on your request when the information we have is insufficient to accommodate your request. In any event, we will respond to you as soon as reasonably possible to advise you of the outcome of your request. Your Privacy Rights Regarding Direct Marketing

Blueprint Medicines does not provide your personal information to third parties for their use in direct marketing.

California Consumer Privacy Act - Notice for California Residents

If you are a California resident, this section supplements the information above regarding the collection, use, and disclosure of personal information that is covered by the California Consumer Privacy Act of 2018 ("CCPA").

The CCPA gives California consumers the right to know what personal information covered by the CCPA is collected about them, how it will be used and to whom it is disclosed. The CCPA gives California consumers the right to request: (1) access to such personal information, (2) deletion of such personal information, and (3) that such personal information not be sold to the extent applicable under the CCPA.

The purpose of this notice is to describe our practices regarding the collection, use, disclosure, and sale of personal information covered by the CCPA and instructions for submitting CCPA data privacy requests. Your Rights

The CCPA provides you (as a California resident) with specific rights, subject to certain exceptions.

- <u>Right to Know.</u> You have the right under the CCPA to request that we disclose what personal information we collect, use, disclose, and sell. The process for exercising this right is described below in the "How to Submit a Data Privacy Request" section. Please note that we may not be required to provide you access to the specific pieces of information we have collected about you if we are unable to verify your identity.
- <u>Right to Deletion.</u> You have the right under the CCPA to request deletion of personal information about you that we have collected from you. The process for exercising this right is described below under the "How to Submit a Data Privacy Request" section. We may not be required to delete personal information under certain circumstances. Specifically, the CCPA includes exemptions that provide that we do not have to delete information that, for example, is necessary to comply with legal obligations including those pertaining to the quality, safety or effectiveness of a product or activity regulated by the Food and Drug Administration, complete a transaction, detect security incidents, or for certain other internal purposes.

How to Submit a Data Privacy Request

To process your request to exercise your Right to Know and Right to Deletion, we must be able to verify your identity to a reasonable degree of certainty. To verify your identity, we will ask you to provide your contact information and relevant identifiers based on your relationship with us. Before we process your request, we will match these data points with data points we currently maintain to verify your identity and your relationship with us.

You may designate an authorized agent to make a request to exercise your Right to Know or Right to Deletion on your behalf. When you use an authorized agent to submit such a request, you must provide the authorized agent

with written permission to do so, and, in certain circumstances, we may ask you to verify your own identity directly with us.

If we are unable to comply with all or a portion of your data privacy request, we will explain the reasons for declining to comply with the request.

Children Under 16 Years of Age

We do not sell the personal information of minors under 16 years of age.
